Paul was of course there since it was important to gain his perspective.

I am happy to report that the overall feeling from both Churches and Rev. Paul was most positive. We have enjoyed good communication and there have been no issues as to how Paul divides his time and energy between the two congregations, a task that certainly could present challenges. Paul, in turn, feels both welcomed and supported by both congregations in his work and singled out both Cindy LaPlante and Joseph Stiefel, office administrators at the two Churches for their great help.

We expressed great satisfaction at our occasional services together but at the same time feel that we have each maintained our own identity with slightly differing programs and needs, an important initial goal and one that Paul has amply supported.

From the standpoint of First Church, I am pleased to report that the Southwick folks do not, at this time, wish to revisit the matter of when our respective services will be held. (You will recall that we initially had our service moved from 10 to 9 AM which was difficult for some of our members; one year ago Southwick agreed to hold theirs at 11 so that we could move to 9:30 AM which has been well received and which we can continue.)

Two different churches, with long histories and separate identities, can find it difficult to share a pastor and have everything work smoothly. While we will continue to have dialogue to ensure satisfaction with

our arrangement, we are all most pleased with where things are.

The **Welcome Home Refugee Resettlement Program** of Catholic Charities ,Springfield, MA is currently welcoming refugee families from Afghanistan, Haiti, Syria, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and Ukraine. Jewish Family Services of Western Massachusetts, as part of their New American Program, has assisted a family of four who arrived from Zambia. When they arrived in the airport in Zambia, they carried an IOM – International Organization for Migration bag which contained all their travel documents and is the legal pathway that allowed them to board a plane and cross the border. A simple printed document served as their travel papers. JFS volunteers met them at the US airport. The parents have jobs, and the teenage children attended a local high school. This is one success story of some 640 refugee clients that JFS has supported in the first six months of 2023. The JFS staff provides all of these individuals with culturally and linguistically appropriate case management services and behavioral health services to help these clients cope with trauma, torture, and oppression.
