In accordance with the by-laws of the First Congregational Church, Westfield MA., Article VIII, section 2, The Annual Meeting of the Church shall take place during the month of February upon a date designated by the Church Council. This year's Annual meeting will take place on Sunday, February 11th, 2024 with a snow date of Sunday, February 18th. The meeting will take place following worship service. The reports of all Officers Committees and affiliated organizations shall be made in writing and accepted at this meeting. Officers of the Church and Committees shall be elected at this meeting. Nominating Committee shall prepare a ballot nominating one person for each position to be filled at the Annual Meeting of the Church. The right of a member to make nominations from the floor shall always be recognized. This ballot shall be accepted by the church at this meeting. At the Annual Meeting of the Church, the members of the Church will vote on the budget as a single intact entity.

Snow and cold weather are in the forecasts. Kids may come to school without proper clothing or get their clothing wet while playing outside. The school currently needs:


Winter Boots used or new - Girls Sizes: 9, 10, 11, 12, 13

HELPFUL INFORMATION

Westfield Food Pantry Services

- Traditional Pantry Grocery Pick Up: Scheduled Pantry open hours allow families to pick up groceries. Appointments can be scheduled in advance or clients can drop in.
- Pantry Grocery Delivery: Provides food to Westfield residents in need who are unable to make it to the Pantry. Eligible clients may sign up for home delivery
- Food for All Mobile Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry: Distributes prepared meals and/or groceries to local residents by bringing services right into high-need neighborhoods.
- Little Free Food Pantry: Provides immediate, anonymous access to food staples. Located at the Church of the Atonement across from their playground.

Brown Bag Distribution

- This food commodity program is for senior citizens 55 years of age and over who meet specific low income requirements.
- An application must be filled out and mailed to the Western Massachusetts Food Bank, Inc. Applications are available at the Council On Aging; call (413) 562-6435 for more information.
- The brown bag distribution is held curbside at the Senior Center, 45 Noble Street on the Wednesday after the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 9 AM. to 10 AM.

Senior Center Companion Program

- Frail, homebound adults aged 60 and older who are considered at risk of institutionalization are provided a variety of services through the Volunteer Companion Program so that they may age in place in their own homes. Frailties may include general weakness, visual limitations, hearing deficits, mobility restrictions, reduced balance and coordination, memory loss, disorientation, and oxygen use for breathing difficulties.
- Program services include transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, errands, companionship, and hazardous weather check-ups.

- Children and adults who live where violence and hate are common in the United States and in countries throughout the world.
