There will be a Disc golf and pizza party on Sunday May 19<sup>th</sup>

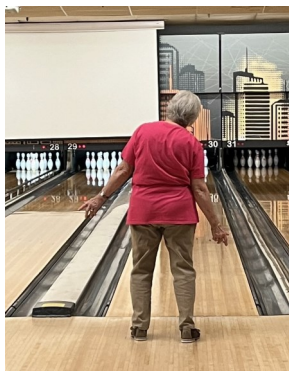
