

# **OPPORTUNITIES FOR GIVING OF YOUR TIME AND RESOURCES**

**Westfield Food Pantry: November 17, 2024 – 3**<sup>rd</sup> **Sunday of each month:** Each month we bring items for the Westfield Food Pantry. Items that are requested include Spaghetti sauce, Pasta, Soup, Crackers, Macaroni & Cheese, Rice, Tuna fish, canned veggies: Corn, Green Beans, Peas, Carrots, Cereal, Canned Fruit, Peanut Butter, Jelly, Cooking oil, Juice, Coffee, Tea, and Sugar.

The **2nd Sunday** in each month your WSC will make an announcement for the items that are in short supply at the Food Pantry. Rebecca Hart will be advising WSC each month of the short supply needs. This month they were asking for EVERTHING, the delivery from Food Bank was delayed.

**Our Community Table/Westfield Soup Kitchen – November26, 2024 -4**<sup>th</sup> **Tuesday of the month:** We will need desserts for the meal. Cupcakes, cookies, brownies, sheet cakes are greatly appreciated by those who share a meal at the soup kitchen. Each donation must serve **24** people. Your World Service Committee will continue to be in touch with the school office to see what First Congregational Church can do to help with their teachers' and student needs. Monthly Highlights: Each month your WSC will highlight one or two of our missions.

This month we are highlighting: National Military Family Association

The National Military Association is a non-profit dedicated to serving service members and their families. They provide spouse scholarships, camps for military kids, retreats for families reconnecting after deployment and for families of the wounded, ill or injured.

**YOUR CHARITABLE DONATIONS: QCDs** : Do you know what a **QCD** - Qualified Charitable Distribution is? You can use Qualified Charitable Distribution (**QCDs**) if you are aged 70 ½ or older, you can make contribution directly from your traditional IRA to a qualified charity. You can donate up to \$100,000 per year without it being considered taxable income, this lowers your gross income (**AGI**) and you do not have to pay tax on the distribution. You can use google or another search engine on a computer for more information or talk to your financial adviser if you have one. First Congregational Church is a qualified charity.

This could be a wonderful way to support your church and charitable giving. Pray about it and see where God is leading you.

**Prayers:** Prayers are needed in so many areas of the World. Please pray for Peace and God's Spirit to touch the lives of country leaders. Pray that peace will be restored.
